Ladies and gentlemen,
Good morning!

It is my pleasure to join you in the International Disaster Resilience Leaders Forum Incheon 2022. Trilateral Cooperation Secretariat (TCS) feel honored to have this opportunity to play a part in this forum as a co-organizer to further promote disaster resilience not only in its member states namely China Japan and ROK but also in this region and beyond.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank UNDRR, Incheon Metropolitan City, the Incheon Institute, and the Ministry of the Interior and Safety if ROK as the main organizers, for preparing and successfully hosting the forum in a timely manner, inviting guests from all over the world.

It is commonly acknowledged that ensuring adequate preparation can minimize disaster risk and damage. Precious lives could be saved, and long time accumulated economic development and assets could be protected, and our resilience for a faster and better recovery could be enhanced.

To collaboratively achieve such preparation for disasters, it is essential that we share both experiences and lessons of previous disaster responses, and learn from each other.

The Trilateral Ministerial Meeting on Disaster Management, which began in 2009, has been held every two years to share the latest information on each country's policies and responses to disasters. TCS has actively participated and supported since its 2nd Meeting in 2011 and strongly promoted cooperation in disaster risk reduction among governments and research institutes of the three countries.

To this end, together with the Ministries of the three countries in charge of disaster management, the ASEAN Secretariat, the UNDRR, local governments in the three countries, as well as all the stakeholders that are participating in this forum, TCS is committed to further enhancing regional and international cooperation in disaster management to further implement the Sendai Framework.
